### PEDAGOGICAL APPROACH

During your interactions with faculty and students, you will explore the approaches and outputs of education policy and delivery in Egypt. This program will give you ideas on designing a curriculum that ties global perspectives on Egypt into an existing course.

"Promoting Reading & Literacy". A focus on reading and literacy promotion efforts underway in schools, libraries, and educational institutions throughout Egypt.

- The importance of reading at the elementary and secondary levels
- What is the reading and writing nexus and its importance in elementary-level education? (Our discussion will place emphasis on how and why reading can enhance intellectual and human capital.)



### BILINGUAL EDUCATION IN EGYPT

- The importance of bilingual education to developing a suite of skills critical to navigating global and adopted-country realities
- Standard Arabic and colloquial Arabic approaches to teaching standard Arabic
- Perceptions of the value of teaching Arabic and perceptions of the value of teaching English
- The impact and challenge of teaching the mother tongue (Arabic in Egypt, & Spanish, Mandarin in the US), and its relationship to the development of cognitive skills.

### HUMANISING EDUCATION IN THE FACE OF A GLOBAL CHALLENGE

- Perspectives from diverse communities
- Dialogue on approaches to humanizing education in the face of a global health challenge
- Strategies on handling/dealing with resultant social-emotional issues
- Dialogue on the 'rhetorically new normal' in education amidst COVID-19 – in and beyond the classroom
- learning about student engagement
- Encouraging students to think critically about global challenges





# SUSTAINABILITY EDUCATION IN EGYPT

## INTEGRATING SUSTAINABILITY INTO THE CURRICULUM

On this professional-learning journey, we explore hydraulic power, generated from stations on the Nile. And we consider wind energy, and solar too – indeed Egypt boasts one of largest solar power plants in the world! We explore how to develop an interdisciplinary curriculum around sustainability, promoting knowledge of the concept at all grade levels.

Through working visits to schools and university campuses, we look at how classroom sustainability projects run from concept phase to final implementation, and we learn how these curriculum-based projects can promote climate change mitigation while catalyzing student awareness around the energy-water-food/agriculture nexus. Our working visits are designed to demonstrate that active sustainability initiatives present the realities of sustainability and renewable energy.



### WE WILL EXPLORE:

- How to make present the realities of sustainability and renewable energy projects - activities linked to the current school curriculum.
- How to teach, track and respond to the need for sustainable education.
- Active projects integrating sustainable development techniques into the daily teaching routine.

You will have the chance to dialogue with knowledgeable subject-matter experts, educators, local activists – and local youth – in moderated discussions about practical climate solutions.

Our dialogues are designed to create teachable moments for your students, which will sharpen their understanding of the shortage of electricity, poor water quality, food insecurity, natural gas shortages, and other economic and environmental impacts of the climate crisis.
